

# *How K-Kids Can Help Me*

This activity will allow members to:

- Learn about K-Kids opportunities and responsibilities.
- Decide what they want to accomplish through the club experience.
- Practice active listening.

Materials needed:

- One printed worksheet per member. Download it at [kkids.org/IDEA](http://kkids.org/IDEA).
- Pens or pencils

How to lead this activity:

It's time to help members find out what K-Kids can help them do.

1. Give each member a How K-Kids Can Help Me worksheet. Give them time to fill it out.
2. When everyone is finished, ask members to raise their hands when they want to answer "yes" to questions.
3. Ask these important questions, and use the blanks to create your own:
  - a. Who is most excited about...
    - i. Sharing ideas about how the club can help others?
    - ii. Helping other people by doing service projects?
    - iii. Learning new skills that will help you be a better person?
    - iv. Being a good influence for your peers?
    - v. Partnering with your teachers, principal and community leaders to make a difference in your community?

4. When the activity is over, thank everyone for their time and participation.
5. Collect members' completed worksheets.
6. Review and save members' worksheets. Club officers can use them later.
